# Primitive Camping On Public Lands

Although we encourage all visitors to take advantage of the numerous private and public campgrounds in the Moab area, limited primitive camping is available. Primitive camping is restricted to designated sites along Highway 313, the Gemini Bridges Road, the Black Ridge Road and Pack Creek Roads, the area accessed by the Mill Canyon Road and the Blue Hills Road, in the Castle Rock area, and south of Moab in the Blue Hill/Picture Frame Arch area. In addition, camping is restricted to designated sites where Kane Creek Road crosses Kane Creek itself, and at Dripping Springs near Ten Mile Wash. These sites are marked with a brown post and a tent symbol. The sites are free, but campers are required to carry out all garbage, including solid human waste. No wood cutting is allowed. The sites are summarized below:

- **Highway 313 - Big Mesa** - There are 12 sites located at Big Mesa which is approximately 8 miles from Highway 191.
- **Highway 313 - Cowboy Camping Area** - There are 4 sites located about 15 miles from Highway 191, just before the turnoff to Canyonlands National Park.
- **Gemini Bridges Road** - There are six campsites located in Bride Canyon.
- **Castle Rock Area** - There are four sites located along the base of Castle Rock.
- **Blue Hill/Picture Frame Arch Area** - there are 12 sites located within the first six miles of this backcountry road.
- **Mill Canyon/Cotter Road/Dubinky Road Area** - there are approximately 40 sites located in this area.
- **Kane Creek Crossing** - there are approximately 28 sites located along Kane Creek where the Kane Creek Road crosses the water.
- **Dripping Spring near Ten Mile Wash** - there are several large campsites on the west side of the road and within the riparian fences.

There are several areas in which no sites are designated and camping is not allowed. The Shafer Basin, which forms the viewshed of Dead Horse Point State Park and is an important bighorn sheep habitat, has no sites. Long Canyon, which is subject to extreme flooding and is also a bighorn habitat, has no sites. The small area between the entrance to Arches National Park and Highway 191 has no sites. No camping is allowed in the Mill Creek area immediately east of the city of Moab, or on the west side of Spanish Valley. No camping is allowed within one mile of developed recreation sites in the Canyon Rims Recreation Area. Remember, when using free designated sites, you are required to remove all solid human waste from the area. You must camp only in marked sites, and no wood cutting is allowed. Following these simple rules will ensure that the sites are attractive to future campers.

## Minimum Impact Practices

1. **Tread Lightly when traveling and leave no trace of your camping:** Drive and ride only on roads and trails where such travel is allowed; hike only on established trails, on rock, or in washes. Camp at designated sites or, where allowed, at previously used sites. Avoid placing tents on top of vegetation and use a camp stove instead of making a campfire. Unless signs indicate otherwise, leave gates open or closed as you find them.
2. **Help keep Canyon Country clean:** Pack out your trash and recycle it, clean up after less thoughtful visitors, and dispose of human waste properly.
3. **Protect and conserve scarce desert water sources:** Camp at least 300 feet from isolated water sources to allow for wildlife access. Where possible, carry your own drinking water. Leave potholes undisturbed and wash well away from pools and springs.
4. **Allow space for wildlife:** When encountering wildlife, maintain your distance and remain quiet. Teach children not to chase or pickup animals. Keep pets under control.
5. **Leave historic sites, Native American rock art, ruins and artifacts untouched for the future:** Admire rock art from a distance and never touch it. Stay out of ruins, leave artifacts in place, and report violations.
